to an important tactical position during a heavy hostile counter attack, and by his coolness and his calm demeanour under fire averted what might have become a very critical situation.

Resaldar-Major FARMAN ALI, Burma Mounted Rifles (Persia). (3159 of 1919.) Risaldar (A.-Risaldar-Maj.) KISHAN SINGH, 22nd

Risaldar (A.-Risaldar-Maj.) KISHAN SINGH, 22nd Cavalry, I.A., (Mesopotamia) For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Tuz Khurmatli, on 29th April 1918. When his squadron was ordered to charge the enemy's position he was the first man to reach the objective, and by his courage and able leadership his troops captured 300 of the enemy and two field guns. He has at all times displayed coolness and determination, and set a fine example to the regiment.

Risaldar-Major SUNDER SINGH, 21st Cavalry, I.A., (Mesopotamia.) For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Kirkuk on 6th May 1918. He was sent forward with a patrol to verify a report that the enemy was retiring. He came under heavy fire from front and flank, but with great skill and coolness manoenvred his patrol into a hollow whence he made a close personal reconnaissance and rendered a report on the enemy's disposition which proved invaluable.

Subadar-Major TULSIRAM GHARTI, 1-2nd Gurkha Rifles, I.A., (Mesopotamia.) For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Resht, on 20th July 1918. During an attack by the enemy on a town, he led his men with exceptional ability and dash, and by the rapidity of his advance, inflicted heavy casualties on the enemy, taking a number of prisoners. Later, he displayed marked initiative and daring in the relief of a beseiged garrison. His conduct throughout the operations was splendid. (150 of 1920.)

Risaldar KAMALUDDIN KHAN, 38th Central India Horse, I A., for distinguished service in connection with military operations in Egypt and Falestine.

Ressaidar REWAT SINGH, 32nd Lances, I. A. (Mesopotamia). For marked gallantry and good work on the 30th May 1919. At Qara Anjir his squadron was heavily attacked. He took a Hotchkiss gun to a flank, and used it with such effect that it delayed the enemy for a considerable time. Though wounded in the thigh, he continued in action, withdrawing his gun to various positions and thereby enabling his squadron to retire.

Jemadar LAL SINGH GUL, 126th Baluchistan Infantry, I. A. (Mesopotamia). For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Sheranis on 17th September, 1919, when with two sections he attacked and captured a point within close range of the enemy Sangars at Khantur. Although heavily fired on, he maintained his position unsupported for two hours until ordered to withdraw. Whilst holding the position he showed great gallantry in moving wounded men, and controlled his command most skilfully throughout. (400 of 1920)

Ressaidar LAURASIB KHAN, 10th Lancers, I. A. (Mesopotamia). For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the 1st March 1920, at Safrah, when in command of a squadron after his squadron leader had been killed. His squadron was suddenly attacked, and, although almost surrounded and outnumbered, by skilful leadership and sound judgment he extricated the squadron with little loss from an extremely critical situation. His gallant conduct and coolness throughout the action were beyond all praise.

Subadar NAURANG SINGH, 1-150th Infantry, I. A. (Waziristan.) For gallantry and good leading on the 5th October 1919, near Manjhi, when surrounded by superior numbers, he extricated his platoon in an able manner. Under his orders seventeen men, eight of whom were wounded, fought their way 4½ miles to Manjhi. He showed personal courage in remaining to the last searching for wounded.

Subadar DAVARAJU, 80th Carnatic Light Infantry, Indian Army (Mesopotamia). For gallantry and devotion to duty on the 7th of May 1920, near Albu Kemal, when in charge of three small picquets. He was heavily attacked by vastly superior numbers, but maintained his position the whole day. His coolness and skilful leading were above all praise, and his determined resistance saved much Government property from being looted.

MILITARY CROSS (WAZIRISTAN.)

Subadar (now Subadar-Major) AMIR KHAN, 2-21st Punjabis, I. A. During operations at Jandola, on 29th June 1921, his company commander was killed, whereon he took charge of the company and handled it with great skill and coolness. At the time he took over command, the company was just starting to cross the Sagar Algard, being on the extreme right of the battalion. The enemy had held up this advance at this point by heavy fire and by carrying out an outflanking movement in force. The situation at this time was critical; if this company had not defeated the enemy flanking movement, the remainder of the regiment would have been taken in rear. Although short of ammunition he defeated the flanking movement, after

which still under heavy fire, he got in all the wounded, rifles and equipment. When the retirement was started the enemy charged; in face of this he completely broke the enemy's rush and carried out a most skilful retirement. His company did not lose a single rifle or piece of equipment, and brought in the equipment of a Lewis gun number who had been killed.

It was mainly due to the courage, skill and coolness of this Indian officer that the regiment was able to effect a successful retirement without the heavy loss in men and rifles which at one time seemed inevitable.

He himself displayed great personal bravery and set an excellent example to his men.
